• Our opportunities to present forums at the above schools varied from one to six, as is typically the case. In all, 424 new and returning young women attended 50 forums during the 2010-2011academic year. This year's curriculum, "Get Ur Good On," gave the participants the opportunity to collaborate with other local schools and to get involved on the national level with Youth Service of America's **Semester of Service**. Service projects varied between the schools and ranged in time from Martin Luther King Day through Global Youth Service Day:

Catholic Community Services—Refugee Outreach Program School supplies and back packs
The "Y" (formerly YMCA) - 1,000 Acts of Kindness
Clothing for local Boys and Girls Clubs
After-school mentoring programs
Mardi Gras Family Night at Salt Lake City Library
Continuation of Community Clean-up
Get-well cards and gifts for a local hospital

During the 2011—2012 academic year, the Dixon Girls Forums will return to the above schools and be introduced to two new schools:

Glendale Middle School—a money-management curriculum in

conjunction with the Utah Association of Financial Services **Hunter Junior High School**—addressing bullying and hurtful
activities in conjunction with The Y's after school program and Safe
Passage Grant
