- Hillcrest Junior High administration asked the 50 participants of the DGFs to create an ambassador program for their school for the beginning of the 2013-2014 academic year. Using their best leadership skills, the participants spent many hours researching and collaborating to create and develop guidelines, forms, name tags and presentations for their school and administrators.

Unique to the Murray School District, it is anticipated the outcome from the “All Connected Together” (ACT) Ambassador Program will show:

Decreased incidents of bullying (based on reports)
Increased attendance at school and school functions
Increase in positive attitudes/school spirit

Data collection will be conducted by the District using their forms.
Analysis will be available summer 2014.

For the first term of the year, participants of the DGFs will be the sole ambassadors as the program works out any problems. Beginning the second term, any student who meets the criteria set by the administration may apply to become an ambassador. No other school in the District has a program of this type, so it was an honor to take on this responsibility. If the program receives a positive outcome report, the ACT Ambassador Program will be instituted in other schools in the District using the DGF participants as trainers and mentors.
